

BASEES 2022 Child Policy

BASEES is committed to enabling members with young children who cannot make alternative arrangements to bring them to the conference.

- 1) At the BASEES conference children are allowed and breastfeeding is welcomed. A private room will also be available upon request for feeding or nursing women to express.
- 2) Children remain the responsibility of their parents or carers at all times. All children under the age of 18 need to be supervised at all times by a parent or guardian. Please note that all under 11s must be within arm's reach of a parent, guardian or other designated adult of the parents' choice.
- 3) There is often limited seating capacity, moreover the content of presentations may sometimes not be suitable to children. Parents/Carers should leave the session if their child becomes disruptive or if there is unsuitable content. Chairs have discretion to ask parents/carers to leave the room with their children when they deem it to be necessary.
- 4) We ask all families to be aware that the college is a place of learning and also a residence for both students and staff. As such we do ask that noise in public areas is kept to a minimum and children kept from playing in the courts or gardens.
- 5) Please be aware that there is a brook running through the garden and a large pond. These are not fenced off and therefore we ask that these areas are avoided. For reasons of insurance liability and safety, infants must be held or be in a pushchair at all times.
- 6) No guests under the age of 18 are permitted in the bar under any circumstances. The bar staff will ask for anyone they believe to be under the age of 25 to show ID to prove their age.
- 7) Attendees who are members of BASEES or are joining BASEES and who require assistance with childcare during the annual conference may apply for financial support. If your application is accepted, you will be provided a small grant towards the costs of childcare during BASEES 2022 to support your participation in the conference.
